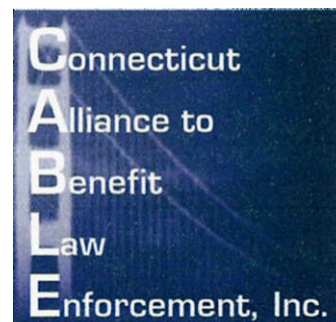




Second Annual CIT STAR Award

The CT Alliance to Benefit Law Enforcement presents its 2008 Crisis Intervention Team “Star” Award to Officer Richard Cable for his strong leadership, advocacy and support of people with mental illness in his community. Officer Cable has been a New London Police Officer since 2001. He currently is assigned to the Nip-It Code Enforcement Team and is a Field Training Officer for the New London Police Department.

Officer Cable has been a strong advocate for Crisis Intervention Programs. Earlier this year he was featured by Rhode Island Public Radio in a story on Crisis Intervention Teams in Connecticut. This summer he also participated in the successful resolution of a suicide attempt by a distraught woman. Additionally, he has participated in the training program for new CIT Officers.

Officer Cable became a certified CIT officer in April, 2005. Throughout his career, he has received a MADD award (2004) and the New London Elk’s Police Officer of the Year (2006).

Officer Cable and his wife, Jennifer have been married for 9 years. Proudly, they are raising their two children, Brandon and Noah.
